The publications page for the Indiana Economic Development Corporation has a link to a compliance report covering subsidy recipents for the years 2007 to 2010. This PDF report lists recipient information for all programs we looked at except for Enterprise Zone recipients. Points are awarded for labeling the maximum award amount a recipient was eligible for, listing the subsidized facilities' address, and reporting on projected job creation. The report could have been improved if it had clarified the year a recipient company received the subsidy. The PDF was also locked, preventing a user from exporting information.

The compliance report cited above claims to include Enterprise Zone Loan Interest Credits, but no recipients are listed despite \$432,263.92 in subsidies being claimed in a three year period between 2007 and 2010. Some Enterprise Zone benefits were discontinued after the state eliminated the Enterprise Zone Inventory Tax Credit. See above.
