Michigan discloses information about subsidy recipients on a map. Unfortunately, there is no search feature allowing a user to find a specific company. To find subsidy recipients, click on the dots. For each recipient, a PDF appears on the right tab entitled "Details." To reveal how much a company received, click on "View Project Summary Report" at the bottom of the tab. These reports are automatically downloaded and must be re-opened for viewing. Three programs we looked at, the MEGA program, the Brownfield Redevelopment program and the Advanced Battery Credits program, are included in this mapping disclosure. Points are awarded for inclusion of the subsidized company's full address, and projected and actual job creation.
